SERVICES PROVIDED: We help citizens by preparing before a disaster, respond to those disasters and assist with the recovery from those disasters.

Prepare –

- Home fires take seven lives a day in the U.S. – most often, in homes without working smoke alarms. To help prevent needless tragedies, the American Red Cross is installing free smoke alarms and educating families about fire safety through our Home Fire Campaign. You can request a free smoke alarm installation by calling 307-439-4167
- Our free “Be Red Cross Ready” preparedness curriculum is designed to help people understand, prepare for and respond appropriately to disaster. The program utilizes a whole community approach to preparedness education and also includes information for older adults and individuals with disabilities, access or functional needs. We teach a step-by-step approach to preparedness action that is manageable, action-oriented and affordable. We can provide training to civic groups, churches and other groups. Please call 307-237-8436 to make an appointment for a presentation.
- Organizations that are prepared to respond to disasters and other emergencies are critical to building and sustaining resilient communities. “Ready Rating” is a free, web-based, self-paced organization emergency preparedness program that helps organizations of all types prepare appropriately, respond effectively and recover quickly from disasters and other emergencies. Ready Rating tools meet or exceed the minimum standards for organizational preparedness set by OSHA. You can access the program by going to [www.readyrating.org](http://www.readyrating.org).
- Our Hands-Only CPR course teaches untrained bystanders how to perform hands-only CPR. Having more citizen bystanders trained in these simple skills can help save lives by putting more cardiac arrest victims within a few steps of lifesaving assistance. The hands-only technique is a skill session that takes less than 30 minutes. Students learn how to check for consciousness, call 911 and give continuous chest compressions. CPR training certification is not provided through this course. To sign up for a free session, please call 307-237-8436.

Respond –

- **Home Fire Response Services:** Services designed to meet the immediate needs of those directly impacted by a home fire. Response to house fires uses the same processes and services as larger events, but are often carried out by small teams of people performing all relevant functions. These services are provided by Disaster Action Teams and can include the immediate provision of food, clothing, shelter, health services, etc. In addition to initiating Red Cross disaster response, Disaster Action Teams determine the need for mobilizing other material, financial and human resources if needed and make appropriate referrals for supplemental and recovery resources and services.
- **Sheltering:** Services designed to meet the short-term housing needs of those directly impacted by disaster. These services typically last no more than 30 days and are designed

to stand up (and down) within hours of notification. Shelter assistance is most often provided in congregate facilities.

- **Feeding:** Services designed to meet the short-term feeding needs of those directly impacted by disaster. These services include coordination, delivery and serving food. Feeding assistance is most often provided in the form of mass feeding on larger events.
- **Health Services:** Services designed to meet the short-term health needs of those directly impacted by disaster. These services include assessing disaster-affected individuals and communities to determine needs and providing care and support to people who have disaster-related or disaster-aggravated unmet health needs. Examples of health services assistance include: emergency direct assistance to purchase medication replacements, assistance with activities of daily living, and meeting the individual health needs of large populations after a disaster or home fire.
- **Mental Health Services:** Services designed to address the mental health needs of those directly impacted by disaster. Disaster mental health interventions are short term and are designed to mitigate the potential long-term psychological effects of disaster. Example interventions include: psychological first aid, crisis intervention, referral to community mental health resources, and education on normal stress reactions, condolence support and community resilience training.
- **Spiritual Care Services:** Services designed to meet the short-term spiritual needs of those directly impacted by disaster. We respond to the need for spiritual meaning and comfort by providing accompaniment, compassionate care, individual and communal prayer and appropriate ritual. Spiritual Care Services assist individuals, families and communities to draw upon their own inner religious and/or spiritual resources and is sensitive to and aware of the varied expressions of faith and belief systems and traditions.
- **Reunification:** Services designed to meet the short-term reunification needs of those directly impacted by disaster. Services include providing human and technological resources to reconnect individuals by facilitating communication from inside the disaster-affected area to outside the affected area. Additional assistance is provided for at-risk individuals and those with health and mental health concerns.
- **Direct Client Assistance:** The provision of financial or other means to obtain relief items and is warranted when individuals and families have serious disaster-caused needs that are met most appropriately through the provision of standardized categories and types of assistance. Direct Client Assistance is most often provided as the Red Cross responds to single-family fires and can scale to major disasters.
- **Distribution of Relief Supplies:** Services designed to meet the short-term material needs of those directly impacted by disaster. Services include the provision of items essential to basic survival, health and sanitation. The distribution of relief supplies is a phased system of delivery that initially supplies essential items such: as food, water, baby formula, etc. and transitions to cleanup and recovery items such as bleach, mops, work gloves, etc. As the needs of those impacted by disaster evolve, so do the items required to meet their needs. Typically, items are distributed via mobile delivery or at fixed sites.

- **Information & Referrals:** Services designed to meet the short-term information needs of those directly impacted by disaster. Services range from providing information on the disaster event and its impact to providing information and referrals to connect individuals with response and recovery resources.

#### **SERVICE TO ARMED FORCES:**

- The Emergency Communications Center (ECC) operates 24/7/365. ECC staff speaks with the family and gathers information about the emergency, the service member and the military command. The worker speaks with an authority who can verify the emergency (example: for a death, the funeral home; for an illness, hospital or doctor; for other emergencies, a third party authority such as police, child protective service, etc.), and obtains current information on the emergency. A verified message is then delivered to the military command, who passes it to the service member and jointly determine if the service member should take leave.
- For military families and personnel who are not close to a military aid society office or after hours, the Red Cross provides immediate access to financial assistance on behalf of the military aid societies. The service member and families call the ECC which then processes the request for assistance and dispatches funds in coordination with aid societies.
- Family Follow-Up is an important aspect of Emergency Services and is provided by the family's local Red Cross unit. Continuing the process initiated at the ECC, caseworkers (the majority are volunteers) call families to determine if the service member has been in contact and if there are other needs that Red Cross can provide, e.g. I&R to other local agencies. Family Follow-Up enables the local Red Cross to establish a helping relationship with clients who have experienced an emergency or difficult situation and to extend Red Cross support to local military families.

#### **TRAINING SERVICES**

SERVICES PROVIDED: The Arc provides a variety of services to individuals with disabilities. Major program areas include:

1. Adult Day Care - Provided to adults with disabilities, in our facility and in the community. Our providers facilitate volunteer opportunities, community activities and help our individuals served work on personal goals.
2. Inclusion – After school and summer programs for children with disabilities. These services included peer interactions and community activities.
3. Respite – Services that can be provided any time of day in the individual’s home, a provider’s home or in the community. These services are provided to give parents/guardians a break.
4. Companion – This is a one to one service provided to individuals 18 years old and over. This service works towards individual specific goals.
5. Child Habilitation – This is a service provided to children, 17 years old and under. This service works towards individual specific goals
6. Personal Care – This service is provided to individuals who require more assistance with activities of daily living and typically have more medical needs. This service has to be provided in the home of the individual served.
7. Homemaking – This service is to assist families with chore-type activities, meal preparation and routine household care.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: Any adult or child that is served by the Wyoming Home and Community Based Waiver System (Developmental Disabilities section), in Natrona County or Converse County.

Staff: Executive Director, Service Coordinator, Adult Day Coordinator, Office Manager, Summer Inclusion Coordinator, outside direct care providers and homemakers.

Accreditation or Licenses: The Arc's program is accredited by CQL (The Council for Quality and Leadership) and by the State of Wyoming Behavioral Health Division.

Geographical Area Served: Natrona and Converse Counties for direct care. We serve Natrona, Converse and Johnson counties for case management.

Application Procedures: Parent application reviewed by Service Coordinator, eligibility determined, and when possible, services delivered immediately.

SERVICES PROVIDED: The Community Based One-to-One Program matches the volunteer and child based on similar interests and personalities. Activities spent together could range from getting a soda, watching a movie, going to the park, playing football, or doing a craft, etc. The time spent together may only be an hour at a time or may last all day depending on the activity.

The Site-Based Program allows a volunteer to visit with a child for a scheduled hour once a week at the child's school or designated site. They might have lunch or spend time during recess with the child. They may also spend some time playing games, reading books, or helping them with a little school work. The activity could vary from week to week. It is not purely focused on tutoring, but rather about establishing a friendship with a child.

The Progressive Youth Program is a preventative and restorative program for teens that are either involved in the juvenile justice system or who may be a risk of entering. We believe that youth

that are at risk of delinquency can benefit from positive youth development and community support while still being held accountable for their behaviors. Our program carefully supports positive reintegration into the community. Through our mentorship and daily prosocial activities, we provide the youth with opportunities for: positive recreation, social skills building, life skills development, employment/workforce training, academic assistance, monitoring and advocacy, meaningful community service, and family support services.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: Any child ages 5 –16 regardless of family structure or socioeconomic status may enroll and we will serve them through high school graduation.

Fees: NONE

Accreditation or License: Accredited through Big Brothers Big Sisters of America.

Application Procedures: We ask the parent to fill out a simple application and then ask them in to visit so we can find out a little bit about their child. As a community action agency, we carry out our mission through a variety of means that include a community-wide assessment of needs and strengths, comprehensive antipoverty plans and strategies, a broad range of direct services, mobilization of financial and non-financial resources, advocacy on behalf of low-income people and partnerships with other community-based organizations to help eliminate poverty and/or solve other social problems.

The Community Action Partnership of Natrona County offers a broad range of services and programs that include the following:

### **Outreach and Advocacy**

We provide information regarding the services available from CAPNC and other providers and will refer individuals to other agencies when appropriate. We serve as advocates to both low-income people and service providers to enable individual and families to meet their needs and live with a sense of dignity and pride.

### **Emergency Services**

The Community Action Partnership of Natrona County has a program available to assist individuals or families in emergency situations. ### **Social Security Outreach Access and Recovery (SOAR)**

Social Security Outreach Access and Recovery (SOAR) is offered by Community Action Partnership of Natrona County. This service helps individuals, who are chronically homeless and have a mental illness and/or substance abuse issues, apply for Social Security. With the SOAR Program, vulnerable clients can be assisted in a non-threatening environment and meet with the same client advocate through the entire application process.

### **Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP).**

RSVP matches volunteers 55 or better with local organizations while focusing on the priority areas of Healthy Futures, Disaster Services, Economic Opportunity, Education, Environmental Stewardship, and Veterans and Military Families. RSVP utilizes the talents and skills of those 55 or better to make a difference in our community through volunteerism.

### **Housing First Program**

Community Action Partnership of Natrona County's Housing First Project is an 18 unit permanent supportive housing program which targets fellow community members who are chronically homeless and experience a mental health disorder. CAPNC's Housing First Project follows the Housing First Concept Model developed by Dr. Sam Tsemberis which is a proven method and clinical practice to end chronic homelessness. In addition to receiving permanent housing, clients also receive intensive therapeutic case management and other supportive services.

### **Self Sufficiency Programs**

Our Self-Sufficiency Programs help participants increase financial assets and/or their ability to manage and utilize resources. We provide the following programs:

Financial Literacy Program - This is a beginning financial management and goal setting group workshop and is based upon changing your life through better money management with budgeting skills, banking skills, and goal setting.

### **Employment Supportive Services**

We can provide our participants services such as:

- Limited childcare assistance
- Work tools
- Uniforms and work clothing
- Books and educational materials
- Transportation assistance

### **Employment and Training Services**

Community Action Partnership of Natrona County will help participants get initial jobs, re-enter the workforce, retain employment, or improve employment and income. Our employment and training program is a series of workshops that take participants through the entire process beginning with interest and skill inventories and culminating in job retention and support.

On an individual basis we also provide:

- Personal Assessment Assistance - We administer interest/skill inventories.
- One-On-One Employment Counseling – We help participants prepare applications, resumes and cover letters through hands-on training. We also help them prepare for and practice job interviews.
- Job Readiness Training – We help participants prepare for general workplace expectations. We can provide or arrange job coaching.
- Job Development – One of our Community Services Specialists works with local businesses to identify current and future job openings.
- Job Search Assistance - We assist participants in locating available job openings, both informally and formally.

- Rental subsidies in the form of Section 8 choice vouchers for low-income households
- Subsidized public housing for low-income individuals and families.

- Homeless assistance in a “continuum of care,” through local communities and nonprofit organizations by providing funds to help the homeless move from the streets to temporary shelter, to supportive housing and ultimately back to mainstream life.
- HOME Investment Partnership Act block grant provides funds to develop and support affordable housing for low-income persons.
- Preventing housing discrimination through public education and enforcement. HUD investigates and resolves complaints under the Fair Housing laws.
- Mortgage and loan insurance through the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). FHA assists first-time buyers and others by providing mortgage insurance to private lenders. It also insures loans for home improvements and buying manufactured homes and assists in providing affordable rental housing by insuring loans to developers and builders who construct or rehabilitate apartments and other housing developments. HUD also administers a Housing Counseling Program to assist tenants and homeowners in property maintenance, financial management and other matters.

HUD provides funds to state and local governments and to nonprofit organizations. Customers do not apply directly to HUD but rather to the entities that administer these programs. SERVICES PROVIDED: As mandated by law through Wyoming Statutes § 9-1-804, the District Attorney has exclusive jurisdiction to (i) Act as prosecutor for the State in all felony, misdemeanor, and juvenile court proceedings arising in the County in his District and prosecute such cases in the District Courts and courts of limited jurisdiction or in other counties upon a change of venue; (ii) Defend against all petitions for Writs of Habeas Corpus filed in his district by any person charged with or convicted of any public offense in his district. This duty does not extend to petitions filed by inmates of State penal institutions nor inmates under Federal Court jurisdiction; (iii) Render assistance as required by the Attorney General in preparation and argument of criminal appeals arising in his district and in defense of petitions for Habeas Corpus filed by inmates in State institutions arising from alleged deprivation of rights at the time of or prior to conviction; (iv) Appear before any Circuit Court judge in the preliminary examination of persons charged with any offense in his district; (v) Appear at inquests held by any coroner in his district; (vi) Appear at all sessions of any grand jury convened in his district by the State of Wyoming; sex offender classification.

The District Attorney is also required to serve on the Juvenile Planning Committee, the Child Protection Team, the Adult Protection Team, and the Community Corrections Board. In addition to those statutory duties mandated by law, the District Attorney and his staff have other duties to insure the effective administration of justice in the Seventh Judicial District and to insure the effective execution of cases which often begin at the investigative stage by law enforcement agencies; prosecute all game and fish violations; prosecute all family violence cases arising within the Seventh Judicial District pursuant to the recommendation of the Domestic Violence Task Force; handle prosecutions of zoning and environmental violations for the County; supervise and manage the Youth Diversion Program established in the Seventh Judicial District functioning as a community-based program to handle juvenile misdemeanants in some fashion other than court processing; terminate parental rights for Department of Family Services; represent all law enforcement agencies in county traffic court and represent the State of Wyoming in all fugitive warrants and probation revocations.

(9) Employer Intervention - Works with employer so that they can allow witnesses to come to court and not lose pay. (10) Travel Arrangements for witnesses when they testify. Notification of Trial Dates. (11) Public Education - Provide citizens with crime prevention information and to advertise the availability of remedial services. (12) Participation on County Protection Team and as a liaison to other social agencies. (13) Will help file for Crime Victim Compensation Application on all appropriate cases.

  - An institution that provides a temporary residence for individuals intended to be institutionalized; or
  - A public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings; or
  - An individual who is doubling up with friends or relatives in a temporary situation and is not paying rent.

People who are “at risk” for homelessness will also be considered for services based upon evaluation by Case Manager.

**Fees:** A minimum fee is charged for people at or below 100% of poverty. A sliding fee schedule is available to those who are above 100% of poverty. No one will be denied solely on lack of income or ability to pay. **We accept Medicaid, Medicare, and S-CHIP.**

Department of Health and Human Services and the State of Wyoming General Fund. Program benefits are determined by a household income based on 60% of the median income for the state, the number of people in a household and the primary heating source.

The Program has three (3) components:

1. Provide financial assistance to a household to offset the cost of home heating.
2. Energy Crisis Intervention Program (CRISIS) which helps with deposits and back bills older than 60 days starting with July 1<sup>st</sup> of the program year.
3. Weatherization Assistance Program is available throughout the year.

**ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:** All eligible LIEAP clients are eligible for Weatherization and are referred to the Weatherization Assistance Program.

**FEES:** Payment is made for the season. Eligible bills are paid from Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> thru June 15<sup>th</sup> for regulated utilities.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES: Applications for LIEAP will be processed starting the 1st working day in October through the last working day of February. Applications for CRISIS will be accepted through April 15th. CRISIS is only available to LIEAP eligible clients. Heating system repair and replacement is only available to LIEAP eligible clients. If you desire these services and have not applied for LIEAP submit an application to see if you are eligible. You are not required to accept LIEAP benefits to receive the services for heating repairs or weatherization. If you are not LIEAP eligible then you are not eligible for heating repairs or weatherization.

If you have received LIEAP services in another state during the same heating season, you are eligible to receive LIEAP services in Wyoming.

Additional foods such as tuna and salmon are added for the fully breastfeeding woman and infant meats for the fully breastfeeding infant. The WIC food package is tailored to the individual nutritional needs of the applicant. Ongoing nutrition and health information is provided. Breastfeeding education and support is available through trained WIC professionals.

The Early Head Start program is a 12 month program that provides a wide scope of services to families with children ages birth to three and pregnant women who meet eligibility requirements. The program focuses on building the parent/child relationship and providing support so that all members of the family can fully realize their goals.
